### Pastoral Letter #8

6<sup>th</sup> May 2020

Dear Church Family,

One virtue which is much needed today is *resilience*: the ability to bounce back. It's a vital trait when events have, in various ways and to varying degrees, knocked over or crushed so many people. Now, as we glimpse – faintly and far away – the light at the end of the tunnel and with it the ending of this dreadful period, many are raising questions about the future. Most of these questions hinge on resilience. How quickly, if at all, are we, our country and our churches going to bounce back? And, it's probably wise to ask some questions before bouncing back, in particular, whether there are things we have learned in lockdown that we'd want to take with us into the new 'normal'. Certainly, as we think about church, we know that we will need to maintain a better online presence for those unable or uncertain about coming to church on a Sunday morning, and to continue with a regular Pastoral Letter as people are saying that they value the sense of feeling part of community that it brings. As the country prepares for an easing of the lockdown, let's be ready to help each other to 'bounce back' and find a new normal. We know that it will be a while before church buildings re-open, so worship online and in our homes will continue for the foreseeable future, but please hold in your thoughts and prayers those who have worked throughout (as key workers), and others as they prepare to return to work. There are, of course, other things we'd like to take with us into the new 'normal' – the sense of neighbourliness that has emerged during the crisis with people being willing to help one another more, families spending more time with each other, and a greater sense of community as a village. Long may they continue.

I do hope that most of you with Internet access were able to view Sunday's service. As a reminder to those who are less confident, these are the steps to follow:

1. Type All Saints Cottenham into the search bar at the top of your Internet screen
2. Click on the search result – All Saints Cottenham. This brings you to the 'Home' page with a picture of the church in the middle
3. On the left hand side of the screen, click 'Sunday Services Online'
4. Half way down the page, click on the underlined purple title of Sunday's service - *10<sup>th</sup> May - 'I am the Way'* - this will take you to YouTube
5. Click on the arrow in the middle of the screen and enjoy!

I hope that the rest of you are engaging with something spiritual on a Sunday, either through the television or radio, or by using the Prayer and Worship Booklet along with the daily reading. It's a good discipline to keep the Sabbath in some way or another.

- Those who are missing contact with loved ones
- Those unwell at this time, particularly Jean
- All those working in the NHS and care homes during the pandemic; all other key workers keeping vital services going
- Parents continuing to juggle working from home with home-schooling and caring for their children
- For the light at the end of the tunnel – for the government as they decide how to move forward in lifting restrictions and keeping us safe at the same time
- For peace throughout the world as we prepare to mark the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Victory in Europe Day.
